



# University education in Environmental Chemistry

Programmes of higher education covering Environmental Chemistry have been established at universities since the 1980s. The Bologna reforms lead to a notable diversification of existing programmes. Today, some 300 programmes of higher education of environmental studies offered in Europe do include chemistry to a various extent in the curriculum. Postgraduate programmes of various kind do exist.

How can higher education of Environmental Chemistry meet the demands set by the significance of the discipline for science in response to societal needs, regulatory developments, and environmental scientists' labour market? The aim of the session is to address present and future challenges, and present and discuss existing and new concepts of higher education of Environmental Chemistry topics. It hopes to attract active students, teachers, experts from academia, industry and governmental agencies interested to explore the setting and matter.
